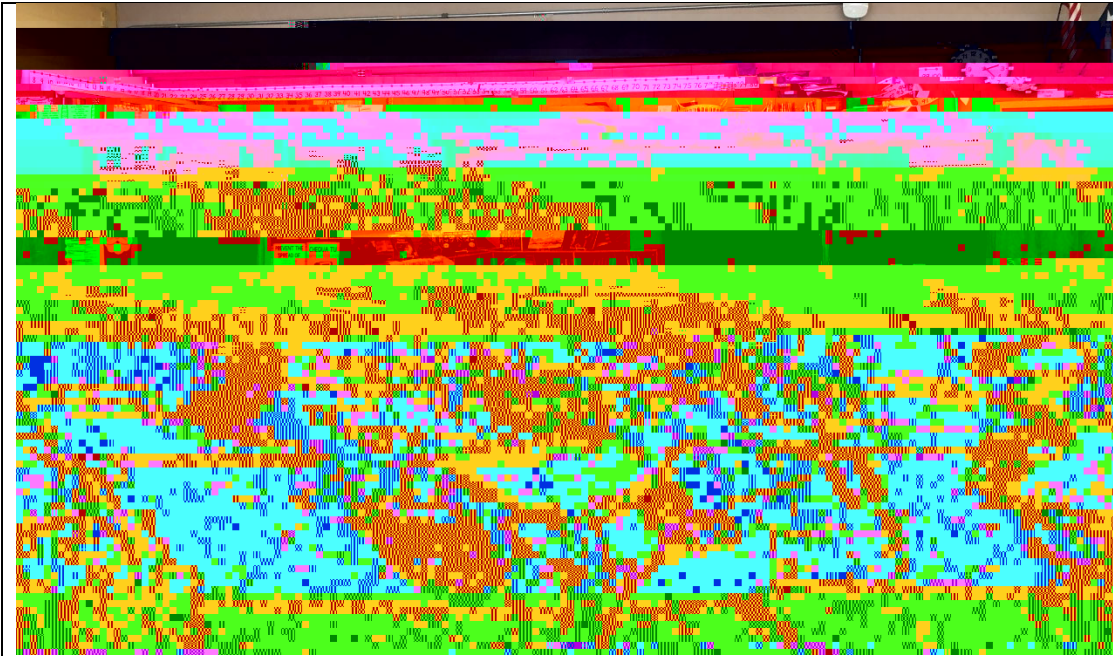

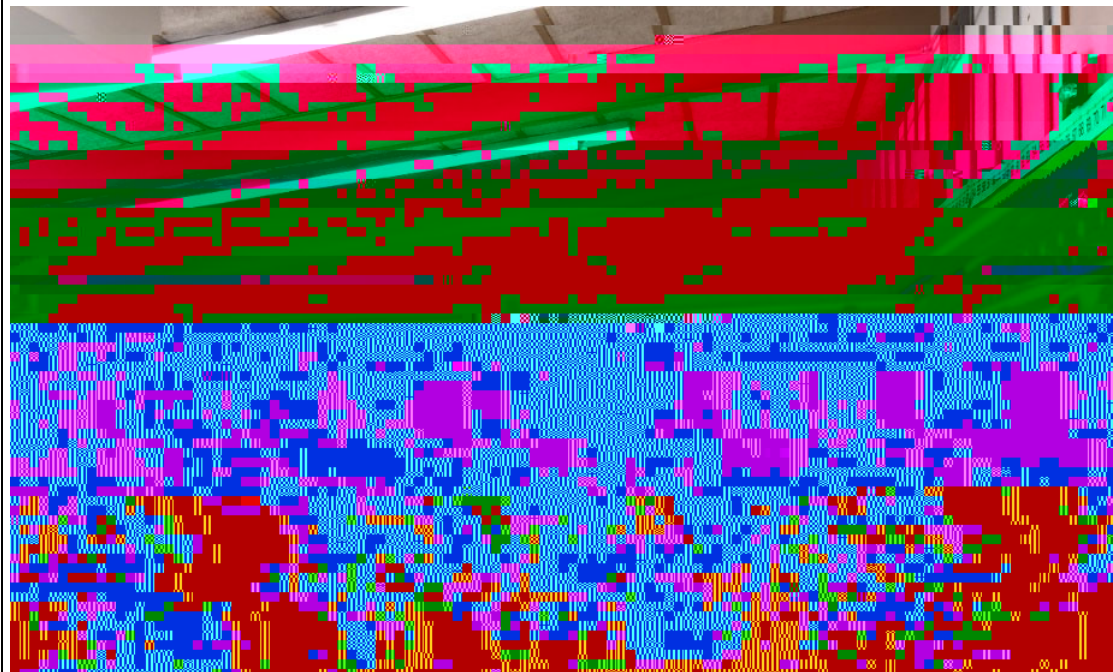
Andrews Elementary School, serving an enrollment of approximately 335 students in northeast Austin, was originally built in 1962 with a stand-alone gym building completed in 1986. The school has 61,700 total square feet on 7.5 acres. The school utilizes portables for instructional intervention programs and for art. The campus supports students preparing to start college-level courses through the Early

There are a few items on the campus of significant importance to the school's identity. There is a tiled alligator statue out front representing the school's mascot that holds a special place in the

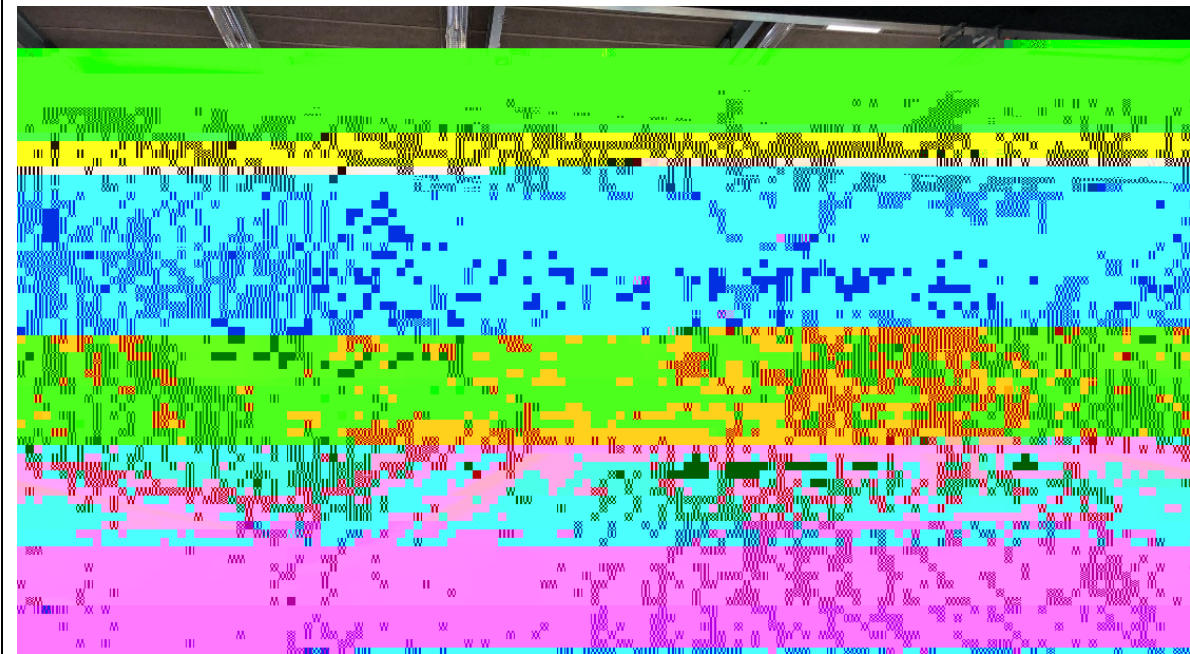
Administration Spaces: Reception is adequately sized and feels welcoming, but finishes need updates.

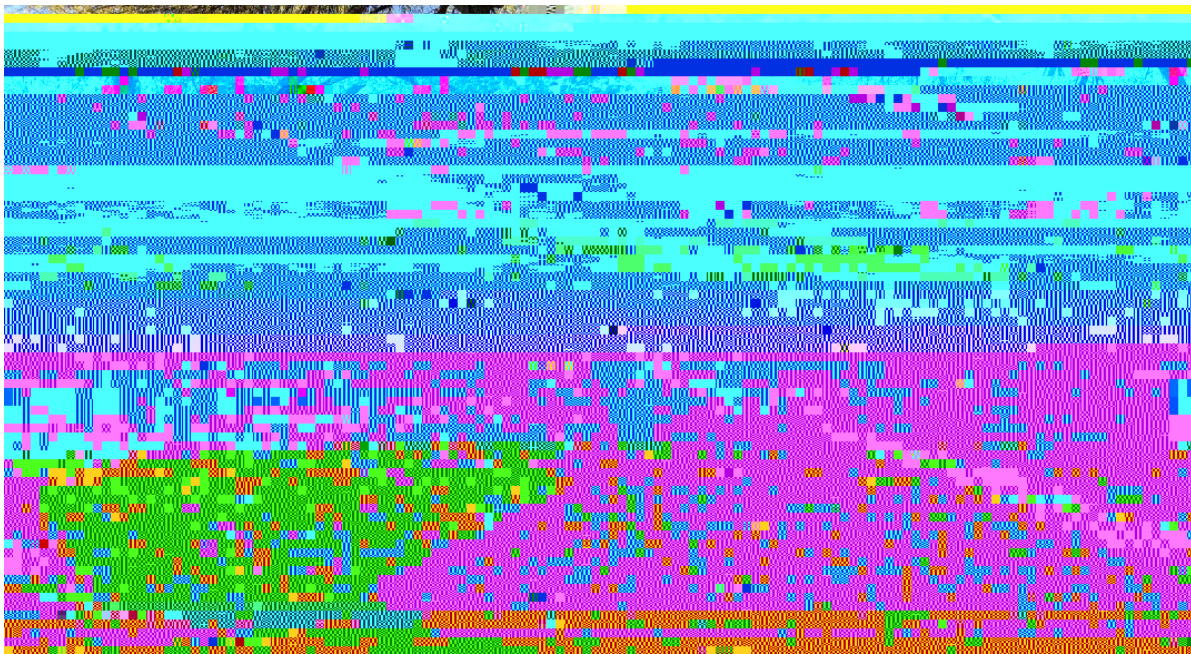
Supporting Photographs

The school loves the alligator statue representing the mascot and it is one feature of the school they say should never change.



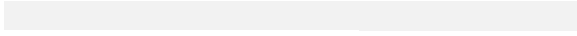
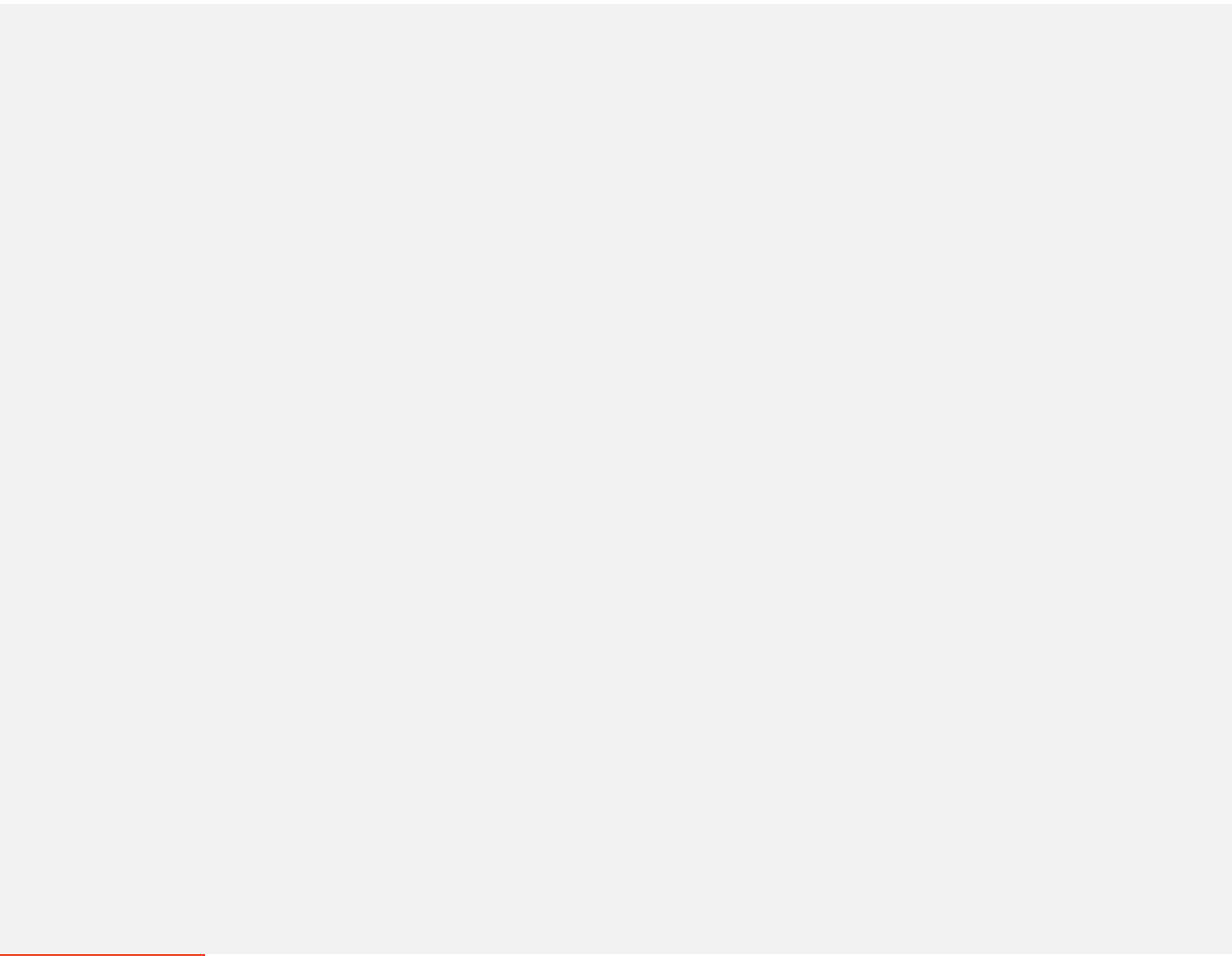
Outdoor space between studio wings could be used for outdoor learning but needs upgrades and is not currently used for any outdoor learning activity.

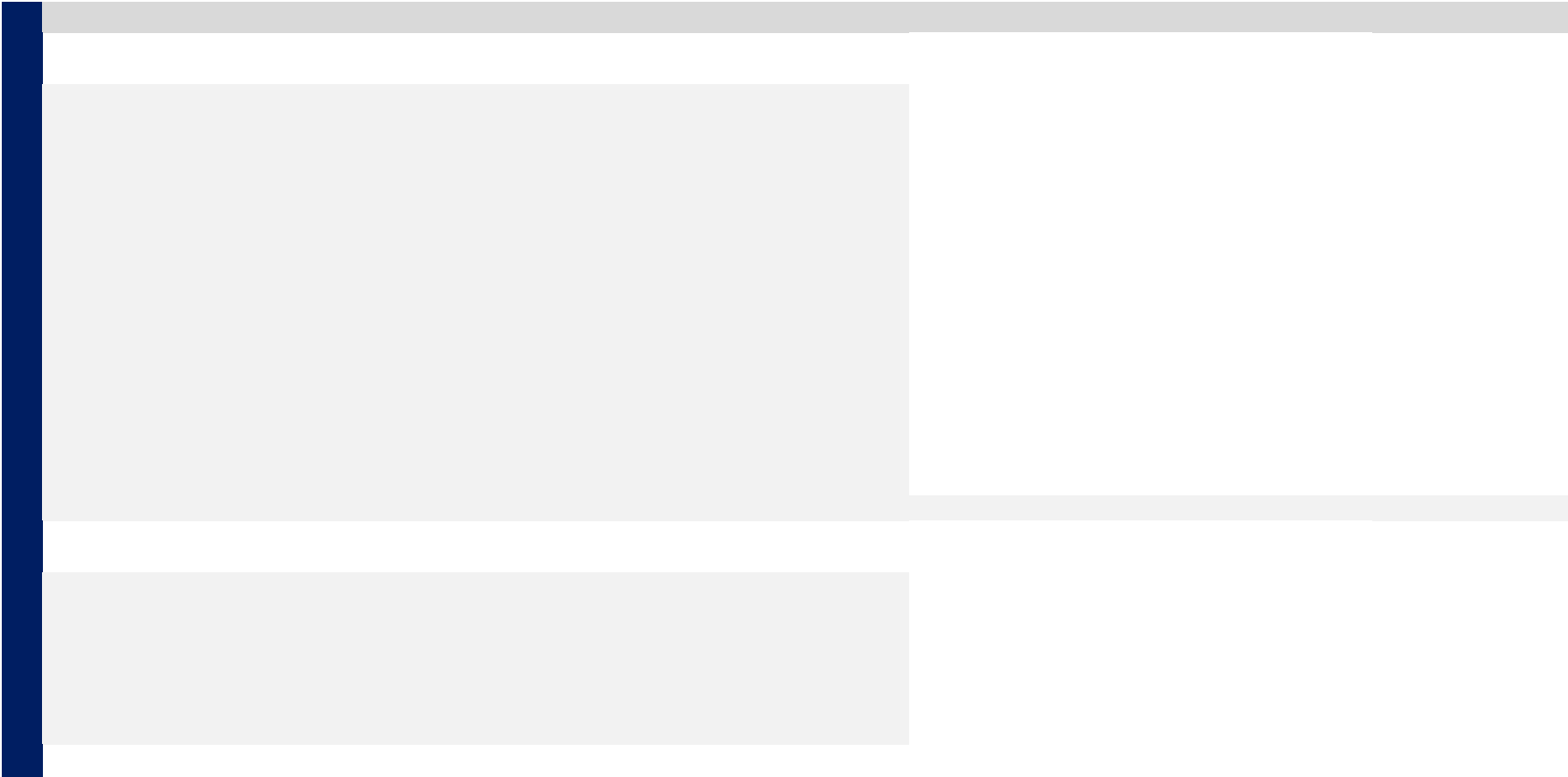
