Title VI, Class Size ReductionAnnual Report Card for Barrington Elementary

For the 1999-2000 school year, **Barrington Elementary** received one additional **second** grade teacher due to Class Size Reduction, a federally funded grants program (Title VI, Public Law 105-277). The goal of this program is to reduce class size in grades 1-3 to 18 or fewer students, so that teachers can provide more personal attention to students.

The Class Size Reduction Program Annual Report Card provides information on class size and student achievement during the grant period. Please note that for some campuses, the impact of the grant on class size may be partially masked by the inclusion of bilingual classes. That is, the addition of a regular classroom teacher typically would not affect the number or size of bilingual classes.

During the 1998-99 school year:

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There were five 2nd grade classes;

The smallest 2nd grade class had 14 students;

The largest 2nd grade class had 19 students;

The largest 2nd grade classes had 17 students.

On average, 2nd grade classes had 17 students.

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Fifty-seven percent of **second** grade students at **Barrington Elementary** scored at or above grade level on the Reading Comprehension portion of the Primary Assessment of Language Arts and Mathematics (PALM) in April, 2000.

PALM data were not available from the district for April, 1999.
